Christmas Offering to Assist in Ebola Fight

Each year at this time the Outreach Council of Country Club Christian Church chooses a recipient for our Christmas offering. This season's offering will be directed to Week of Compassion's efforts to win the battle against Ebola in West Africa, and to help rebuild the health care systems there.

Ebola is a terrible disease. It is only spread by close contact with an infected person, and it is often fatal without modern medical intervention in the early stages of infection. Because of the way it spreads, it can decimate the care givers in a community or family. Those who are willing to care for the infected individual or to provide them with human touch and comfort become the next victims.

It is vitally important that health care workers who are willing to work with Ebola patients receive special training and that they receive protective equipment so

they can care for the patient and not become the next victim.

Week of Compassion partner IMA World Health has partnered with the Christian Health Association of Liberia (CHAL), a network of Christian health organizations in Liberia, and other local health care organizations to provide health worker training and essential supplies to help stop the spread of the Ebola virus.

Getting Ready for God

The season of Advent is a time of preparation. We shop for gifts, we plan and attend parties, we add an extra worship service or two and maybe a concert or pageant to our regular routines. All of this is done to get us ready for the arrival of the Christmas celebration.

However, if we are not careful we will forget that we are also getting ready for the intrusion of God into our lives. The word intrusion is not one that conjures up warm and fuzzy feelings, but it is an accurate way to describe the full aspect of this season. It is a reminder to us that God wants to

come into our lives and take us to somewhere new, to help us see that we are not alone.

We gather at the communion table in our worship services at Country Club Christian Church every week to remind us that God has entered fully into human life. Sometimes it seems strange to pause for the Lord's Supper during the Advent rush to Christmas. After all, who wants to "remember the Lord's death" as we often say during communion, but it helps us recall the sad truth that not everyone wants God in their lives.

At the communion table we recall that this one named Jesus, this one who came preaching simple basic truths about love of neighbor and a gracious life for all, this one, was seen as an intruder by the political and religious leaders of his day. The Lord's Supper is a solemn reminder that these powerful ones sought to silence him. We also remember at that table that the love of God cannot be silenced. Sometimes it is hard to believe that. But the season of Advent invites us to wait for the sound of an Angel's voice declaring above the din,

*And you beneath life's crushing load whose forms are bending low,
who toil along the climbing way, with painful steps and slow,
look now for glad and golden hours come swiftly on the wing;
O rest beside the weary road and hear the angels sing!*



And so we once again say, “next year...” I know we are not alone. And, I know it doesn’t have to be this way every year, but even with advance planning, things usually come up that crowd the Christmas spirit out of our lives.
