# Every Sinner Has a Future

Dr. R. Glen Miles



My son Steven likes to give me a bad time about my music preferences. He wonders out loud if I'm aware that new music has been produced since 1979. I always say, "I know! I love U2. They're great." In reply, he sighs, rolls his eyes and says "Dad, you're so weird."

Steven is glad to know that I do have some hip and cool friends, like my buddy Russ, who listen to music from this century. Russ sent me a text the other day with this line, "Every sinner has a future and every saint has a past."\* Then he texted a moment later, "That'll preach!"

He's right it will. The line is from the song, "Salvation Works" by Jennifer Nettles. I had never heard of her but I found out she's one of my wife's favorite singers. I finally googled it and gave it a listen. She's not the Eagles or Fleetwood Mac but I liked her voice and her country style right away.

I've preached at least 1,000 sermons. I've given keynotes and talks to youth groups and senior adults. I've read through the Bible a few times and taught hundreds of Bible studies. I love it, though, when a simple and clear presentation of the gospel can be spoken in a single sentence. Rob Bell is well known for his two-word sermon, "Love wins." The Apostle Paul wrote most of the books of the New Testament but his words to the Corinthians, "Love never fails," will forever stand the test of time. Of course, Jesus' clear and simple repetition, "Love God, love neighbor," is universal in Every its power.

Jennifer Nettles may not be the next great theologian but her line rings true. She's unearthed the simple clarity of the teaching of Jesus. Everyone you meet, no matter how perfect, beautiful, smart and successful they may be, has something – something heavy – they are carrying. And every person you meet, no matter how far they seem to have fallen, has a future that can begin in that unbelievable moment named now.

#### **Taco Salad for 200**

We're looking for people who love taco salad – and will share that love by cooking hamburger on a Sunday or Monday afternoon or evening. The hamburger becomes the main ingredient in our "guest favorite" Taco Tuesday meal served at the Cross-Lines Community Outreach Food Kitchen.

Our church has a 20-plus year partnership with Cross-Lines. Volunteers cook hamburger one or two days before the first Tuesday of each month. Another team of 10 volunteers prepares and serves 150-200 taco salads to Cross-lines lunchtime guests.

We need teams of 2-3 volunteers to cook the 30-60 pounds of hamburger either in our church kitchen or at home. The seasoning, cooking, and clean-up can be completed in about 2 ½ hours. The hamburger is provided. The cooked hamburger is picked up from our church Tuesday morning.

If you cannot help with the cooking or serving, but would like to participate, you may donate toward the \$175 needed each month for the food. We purchase milk, lemonade, cheese, lettuce, taco seasoning, salsa and chips for the lunch. Currently, the beef is donated, however, that is a month-tomonth donation.

### No Vacation?

It was 6:30 a.m., mid-winter, cold and dark outside the daycare center. The young mother was dropping off her daughter. We were introduced, visited, then the mother headed for the door. At the last moment, she turned, blew one more kiss to her little girl and stepped out into the darkness to make her way to a service industry job.

The staff explained to me that the mother brought her little girl to their nonprofit center every morning and they escorted her down the street to school. At the end of day they cared for the girl until her mother

returned. From the center, the pair went to a relative's home where the girl stayed while the mother went to her second job. You see, the young woman could not support herself and her daughter on what she earned in her low-pay job with no benefits.

That scene was years ago but it is etched on my mind and heart.

As the summer vacation season swings into high gear, our newsfeeds are filled with blogs about the importance of down time and rest. Spend time in nature and you will be more compassionate. Agreed. Get away from the daily grind and get a fresh perspective. Sure thing. Whether from a spiritual or scientific perspective there is a clear consensus that we need time to rejuvenate and refocus. I hope that you will have the opportunity for rest and vacation over the summer, as will I.

That said, I am mindful that vacation (or paid time off, as it is now called) is a luxury that many of our neighbors do not enjoy. For those who labor in service economy jobs (or worse, are unemployed) vacation, sick days, or maternity leave are only an elusive dream.

Which brings us back to our re-creation time this summer. Time away from our daily routine and responsibilities opens a space for us to hear Spirit's call to re-imagine the world, not only for ourselves but for all people. Perhaps, this summer, our imaginations will envision ways we can organize our world such that a mother does not have to work two poverty-level jobs to barely get by.
