Capital Campaign Update

We are happy to report that in the last three months, the church has received pledges and gifts of more than \$1 million as part of our updated Capital Campaign, bringing the campaign total to approximately \$3 million. As you know, because of a dramatic increase in the estimated cost of the exterior repair of the church, the goal of the Capital Campaign was increased from \$3.3 million to \$4.9 million.

Work on the exterior is proceeding on schedule, and we anticipate that all of the work will be completed in the fall of 2013. The renovation of the organ will begin after Easter and



will be completed before Advent.

If you wish to make a new pledge or increase your existing pledge to the campaign, pledge cards are available in the church office. Many members have chosen to simply extend their existing pledges by one, two or three years. You can, of course, make a cash gift to the campaign by sending a check to the church marked "Capital Campaign" or an online gift by visiting cccckc.org and clicking the "Give" tab. However you choose to give, your gift will be appreciated.

This information is incredibly helpful. It tells us that the single most effective way for us to grow the church is through you, our members and friends. Of course, we will continue to provide a website. Sunday’s services will be aired every week at 8:30 a.m. on 1660AM as we seek to spread the good news of God’s all inclusive message for all. We’ll give out sugar cookies, with an invite to Christmas Eve services, to all of the attendees at the Kansas City Brass Christmas Concert. And we’ll do many other creative and innovative things to get the word out about our church on Facebook and Twitter.

All of that matters and is very important to our multi-layered communications approach but YOU are still the most effective piece in the puzzle that is often labeled church growth. For example, last December we had “a bring a friend Sunday.” We had our largest Sunday attendance since Festival Sunday that day. Our Christmas Eve services were very well attended. Many of the first-time visitors were invited by a friend and many of those have returned to worship this month.

Like, Comment, Share

Like, comment, share. Three standard words in English lexicon. Yet when I used them recently in a meeting, several folks gave me blank and confused stares. I was encouraging a group of church leaders to help increase the church's presence on social media, and was discussing how to do that through "liking," "commenting," and "sharing."

Later that day, I was telling my mom about the conversation. She's pretty comfortable with modern technology— she regularly texts me from her new smart phone— but she gave me the same confused

look I'd seen earlier. "What's social media?" she asked.

So for the benefit of those of you who have no idea what I'm talking about, here's a brief tutorial.

Social media is a term broadly used to describe forms of electronic communication through which users create online communities to share information, ideas, personal messages, and other content.* More specifically, it refers to Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, Pinterest, blogs, Youtube, etc. Places where people share photos and videos, comment on content other people share, and exchange information.

The church uses two of these sites as our primary social media presence, Facebook and Twitter, and you can help expand our reach. Once or twice a day, I post something to the church's Facebook page: a link to the audio file of Glen's most recent sermon, a photo of a recent event, a reminder about an upcoming Bible study class, devotional material. As you're scrolling through your Facebook news feed, you might see something the church has posted. Below the church's post you will see three words: Like, Comment, and Share. Click Like if you want to give the church a virtual thumbs up. Click Comment if there's something you'd like to say about the post. (Or just type in the box below the post.) If you click Share, you'll see a box allowing you to share the church's post with your specific set of Facebook friends.

When you click one of those options, the church's activity ripples out to your Facebook friends, extending our reach significantly. You demonstrate to your friends you care deeply about your church. It's an easy way to show others who we are and what we do.

If you have questions about Facebook or social media in general, don't hesitate to contact me. As Glen's column on page 3 suggests, your invitation or recommendation is the most effective tool we have to get people to visit.

1st-2nd Grade Mystery Trip



Touching the Soul

Music has the capability of touching the human soul in ways that mere words or visuals cannot. Imagine watching a movie that has no musical score, or watching a ballet where there was no music. No matter how artistic, we would come away feeling that something was lacking.

It is music that can move us to touch the very core of our being in simple or profound ways. When music is coupled with a really fine text, the experience can be even deeper.

It's hard to imagine that we are already looking toward Lent and Easter. Our Christmas decorations are barely stored for another year. And yet, we are moving into a new season as the church year pushes ahead.

On the first Sunday of Lent, Feb. 17, the Chancel Choir will present special music during the 11:00 a.m. worship service. The overarching title for our offerings is "Songs that Touch the Soul." That day, we will sing five pieces, each with a profoundly moving text, coupled with music that lifts the nature of each text to a higher level.

Each text has been chosen to give us a progression starting with the premise I stated in the opening sentence of this article. From there we will present two texts that take us to the darker places in life: the Holocaust and the loss we experience when someone dies at too young an age. We will end with two texts that are both very hopeful. One lists the highest attributes of human nature with the reminder that we, as human beings, have the capacity to strive to keep these attributes alive in our world. Finally, a hopeful text set by John Rutter looking to the day when the world will be free of suffering and death. Composers represented on Feb. 17 will include Daniel Gawthrop, Z. Randall Stroope, Dan Forrest, Lee Dengler, and John Rutter.
