## Christmas Offering to Benefit Education

Each year at this time the Outreach Council of Country Club Christian Church chooses a theme for our Christmas offering and two organizations that will be recipients of the offering, one that is local and one that is in another country.

This year, the theme for the Christmas Offering is "Improving Lives Through Education." There are many, many needs in the world, and those needs only seem to get greater every year. We are called to help meet people's needs, but if we can educate people to meet their own needs, we help them for life, not just for the present.

Our two recipients work to educate people to help themselves. Della Lamb, one of our PartNErship agencies in the Northeast area of Kansas City, is our local recipient. Della Lamb provides programs for infants, toddlers and preschoolers, and sponsors and provides facilities for a charter school serving 600 children a day. The agency also has adult education classes in English as a

Second Language, GED tutoring, and a number of Life Skills programs such as Nutrition, Money Management, Employment Skills and Self-advocacy Skills. While the scope



of Della Lamb's services is wide, the core of what they do is to improve lives through education.

Our International recipient will be CEPAD, our partner in Nicaragua. CEPAD was born after a

terrible earthquake flattened Nicaragua's capital city of Managua. The protestant churches of Nicaragua joined together to help organize and coordinate the rebuilding and relief efforts and the resulting organization was CEPAD. Since that disaster, CEPAD has worked to help the poor rural people of Nicaragua with programs that educate



them and help them to help themselves. CEPAD's programs empower the poor in many ways, such as teaching farming methods that provide better

balanced nutrition for rural families. CEPAD teaches rural communities to be organized, and through that organization builds facilities for clean water and resources that help market local products. They also work with mission groups to help them serve the people of Nicaragua in the most constructive ways. There is no way that we would be able to do the work we do in Nicaragua without CEPAD.

## Tax Law Change for Charitable Giving

There is a tax law change scheduled to go into effect Jan. 1, 2014. Currently most qualified charitable distributions from a traditional IRA by individuals 70½ or older to an eligible charitable organization reduce the amount of federal income taxes an individual pays. The change in law will eliminate this tax benefit. Qualified gifts until Dec. 31, 2013 still qualify for the tax benefit. The church recommends that you consult a tax professional or attorney for further information about this change and its possible impact on your giving. Country Club Christian Church appreciates your generous support now and in the future. The business office is always glad to assist to answer general questions about giving to the church.

## Waiting

Soon. Soon Christmas will be here. Soon all the organ will be done. Soon the exterior work on the church will be completed. Soon the parties will begin. Soon the family will gather for the holidays.

We all have things we are expectantly waiting for. For many of us, it is an agitated sort of expectation. We live in a world where we have come to expect "it" to be done "now." For most of us, we have learned to wait. For some, waiting is excruciating. But it is normal to be expectant and excited: children come alive this time of year with an ever-growing anticipation of what Christmas morning might bring. Even for many of us adults, the anticipation is made sweeter by know-

ing what will be at the end of the period of waiting.
