Update from the Congregational Board Chair

Following Dr. Glen Miles' announcement of his resignation on Nov. 30, the Congregational Board has begun to organize next steps regarding the search for the church's next senior minister. I want to share what has been done and what you can expect in the next month.

On Nov. 29, I hosted a conference call with Board members to inform them of Glen's plans, in advance of his announcement to the church staff and the congregation on Nov. 30. On Dec. 5, the Personnel Committee met with the staff as part of the annual holiday staff appreciation lunch, and Jen Parker, Personnel Committee chair, communicated with the staff the following day to provide reassurance during this period of change.

Scott Glasrud, 2017-18 Board Chair-Elect, and I have spoken with Board consultant, Dan Hotchkiss, to discuss next steps for the Board and his general advice as we navigate this change. The Personnel Committee met on Dec. 13 to review existing church policies, past experiences, a variety of search options, and the most effective ways for the Board to serve as a key resource in this process.

There is no set timeframe for this process because this is an important decision that deserves time to explore, but I will keep you updated as we move forward. In the meantime, know that the Congregational Board and the Personnel Committee, in partnership with the staff, remain committed to the continued growth and evolution of our congregation, and we will continue to serve the ministries and mission of our church.

New Phone System to Be Installed Dec. 28

The church is getting a new phone system installed on Wed., Dec. 28. During the transition to the new system, it is possible there may be a brief interruption of phone service. If you need to reach the church for any reason on Dec. 28 and are unable to, please call 816-809-0383.

This new Voice Over Internet Protocol (VOIP) system features direct dial lines and allows staff to receive voice mail messages both in the traditional way and via email, ensuring your messages are received in a timely manner, especially if staff members are out of the building. The church phone number will not change.

Christmas Offering to Benefit Heart to Heart International

Each year at this time the Outreach Grants and Special Offering Team of Country Club Christian Church chooses a recipient for our Christmas offering. This season's offering will be directed to a local charity, Heart to Heart International. Heart to Heart continues to provide relief and help for the victims of Hurricane Matthew.

Disasters such as Hurricane Matthew in October 2016 make the news when they happen, but all too often our attention is drawn away from the suffering and need for help by other news such as the recent elections. The damage to Haiti and the coast of Florida and the Carolinas is immense. In Haiti, an estimated 200,000 homes were destroyed leaving 1.4 million people in need of humanitarian aid. In North Carolina an estimated 100,000 homes were damaged or destroyed. The damage to infrastructure and agricultural crops was estimated to be in the billions of dollars.

Heart to Heart prepared in advance of Hurricane Matthew by storing needed medical supplies and equipment in Port au Prince so that they could respond immediately to help the victims there. They dispatched mobile medical units to Florida and the Carolinas to help provide medical help there as well.

Our annual Christmas Offering is a way for our church to extend its reach and to carry out the Christian mission to help others in need. Heart to Heart is making a difference in the lives of many people, and they deserve our support.

A Quiet Christmas

Julie and I spent my day off last week beginning the process of prepping our house for sale. We decided to leave most of the Christmas decor in storage. We will hang the stockings over the fireplace and we have a beautiful Christmas arrangement of flowers from friends on display but nothing more.

At first I was saddened by this. It's our last Christmas in the home where we have so many wonderful memories of holidays past. I kinda sorta wanted to go ahead and unpack all of the boxes marked "Xmas" and just decorate anyway. I tried to talk myself into setting up the creche with the

baby Jesus and the flying angel, hanging the mistletoe above the entryway and putting up all of the many wonderful decorations Julie has collected over the years.

At some point when we were talking about whether we should or should not do our usual thing for December Julie said, "The more I think about this, the more I like the idea of a quiet Christmas. We can put up the stockings, wrap the presents, plan a wonderful meal and simply enjoy each other without going all out like we usually do."

I liked her idea. But it wasn't an easy decision. Sometimes we teasingly call Julie, "Christmas Carol." She loves everything about Christmas. Especially decorating the house inside and out. If she has not figured out her plan for decking the halls by August she feels like she is way behind.

Volunteers for Della Lamb's Operation Santa Claus

This year, Country Club Christian Church provided 26 volunteers (including 10 staff members) who worked a total of 187 hours helping sort clothes and bundle them for Della Lamb clients. Della Lamb will provide new clothing outfits for about 2,000 children, including refugees, those in the early education program and others whose families have registered with Della Lamb social services. The parents also select toys for their children and teenagers will receive gift bags and backpacks filled with school supplies, personal items and candy. Adults also receive gifts, and families will receive fresh and non perishable foods for a holiday family dinner. The total number of people served is well over 5,000. The items were distributed last week over four days.

Glen Miles Is Grace

He was the first person I told that I had cancer. And he was wise enough to say nothing. Week after week he has shaped my thinking about God and challenged me to risk my life to follow the Savior of the world. So like you, I too felt sad when I learned that our Senior Minister was resigning to accept a call to serve another of the greatest churches in this country.

For 14 years I have been able to shout across the hall from my desk at him. There were days when I spent more hours in meetings with him than I did with

my family at home. There were days when we gave high fives and fist bumps because we knew that the hard work of this congregation had proclaimed God's love with crystal clear trumpet blasts. And there were days when we wept because we didn't know if the Holy Spirit was anywhere in the vicinity. We co-officiated at weddings and funerals. We collaborated on sermons. We counseled each other out of tough professional and personal dilemmas. He knows my weaknesses. And I know his.

Maybe that is why the word that we will always think of when we think of Glen Miles is grace.

Grace.

He not only preached grace. But he practiced grace. Like a prism he held up the word and invited us to see a new side of it. Like a race, he ran it, never giving up. He wouldn't let us off the hook. He wanted us to know grace was real for each of us and for the world. And so it is only natural that we would pause now to feel the sadness of one chapter of the church life shifting. And it is only natural that we would wonder aloud "what next?"

Advent is the season of waiting. We not only wait for the Messiah to be born on Dec 24. We also wait to see where God will lead our congregation next. We wait. And sometimes waiting is so annoying. So frustrating. So long. So uncomfortable. But sometimes when we wait, sacred and wonderful mysteries unfold.
