Invite our neighbors into highly visible activities based on a variety of shared topics, goals, or interests.

Country Club Christian Church and Spire Chamber Ensemble presented a concert featuring "This Love Between Us", a work by composer Reena Esmail. 650 attended in person and online, including 35 guests from the Harmony Project who enjoyed a pizza party and special reserved seating.

Composer, Reena Esmail, discussed her work with a panel of interfaith guests, reflecting on core themes of love, unity and harmony. 300 attended the online panel discussion.

Our congregation hosted the annual senior minister's conference for 45 Disciples of Christ clergy from across the U.S.





Anna Carter Florence, Columbia Theological Seminary, preached at 3 services and guest hosted an Elder/Deacon Retreat.

Krista Tippett, Peabody Award-winning broadcaster, and host of the On Being podcast, spoke to a gathering in the sanctuary and online on the topic "Remaking the World". 378 attendeed.

Country Club Christian Church and American Public Square presented a special "KC at the Square" event that sought understanding of the recent tensions over Kansas City's police budget. 200 members of the KC community attended.

Many neighbors joined us for the Centennial Block Party, Trunk or Treat, Live Nativity, and Spring Fling outdoor events.

The War in Ukraine, A Christian Response – Mike Graves and guest co-speaker, Dr. Vince Clark, led an urgent conversation that provided historical context and a thoughtful exploration of how Christians can respond to the war in Ukraine.

Podcast Groups – Created in partnership with Krista Tippett's "Remaking the World" guest lecture, members were invited to gather and reflect together over an episode of Tippett's On Being podcast.

Celebration Dinner and Auction – After two years delay, the Auction was back at the Main Event in April.

Bible & Art Trip to Italy – Guided by Mike Graves and Nelson-Atkins Docent, Donna Houtteman, 50 travelers explored Rome and Florence and learned about the artists that have shaped our visual understanding of many biblical stories.





Community Camp – 75 campers returned to the YMCA at Estes Park and the Rocky Mountains to enjoy hiking, reflection, and fellowship.

Roots – This fellowship group for young adults in their 20s and 30s gathered for 10 different socials and service projects throughout the year.

Faithbook, Faithbistro, Faithpub – Women and Men explored scripture, heard guest speakers on spirituality and real-life issues, and formed friendships during weekly and monthly gatherings.

Wednesday and Disciple Bible Study – Members gathered to study the scriptures and deepen their relationship with the Bible and each other.

Monday Night Classes – "An hour spent in study is an hour spent in prayer." 18+ Monday night classes offered biblical topics, spiritual growth and many opportunities for prayerful study.
